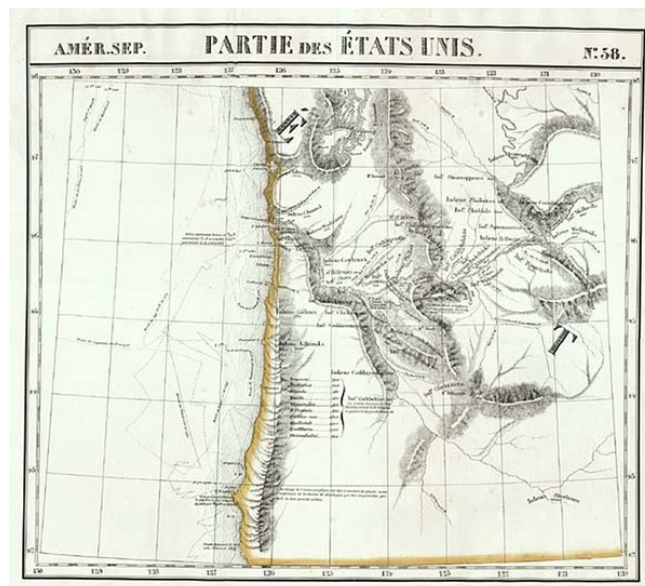

Description:

Highly detailed map of the region bounded by the Oregon-California Border in the south to the southern portion of Puget Sound. Many Indian Tribes shown, with populations. Extends to just east of the Cascades. Mt. Rainer is shown, along with Ft. Astoria and Ft. Clatsop. One of the earliest maps to provide substantial detail along the Columbia River. Various explorer's routes shown off the coast, including La Perouse, Cook, Vancouver, de La Felice, Meares, Marchand, etc. Lewis & Clark notes shown. A remarkable map in comparison in terms of scale, at a time when no other map maker was publishing maps of this region. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. His treatment of the Western US is a landmark in the history the cartography of the Transmississippi West, undertaking to map in 20 sheets a region which American publishers were virtually ignoring.
