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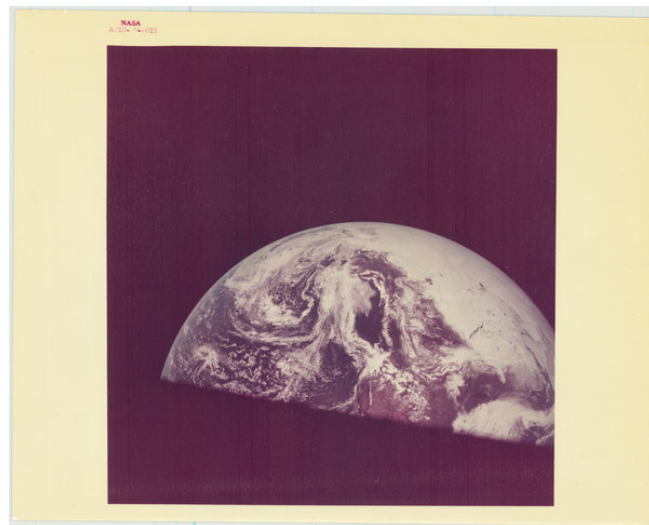

Description:

This is an image of the earth, taken during the trans-lunar injection of the Apollo 10 spacecraft. The Pacific Coast of North America is visible from Los Angeles to the Aleutian Islands. In California, the Central Valley gives way to a snowy Sierra Nevada, with the Basin and Range Province dry. The Pacific Northwest is, somewhat unsurprisingly, overcast and covered with clouds, clearing near Vancouver. The Canadian and Alaskan Coast Ranges are visible. To the east, Lake Superior is visible, New England is experiencing severe weather, and Hudson Bay is ice-covered. In all, this is a stunning view of the earth.

The photo number is AS10-34-5012. The image was taken on 70 mm SO-358 film.
