Description:

A magnificent hand-colored engraved celestial plate from "the most elaborate atlas of stars and constellations published to date and perhaps the last great star atlas." - David Rumsey

Impressive celestial engraving from the large folio 1801 first edition of Johann Elert Bode's *Uranographia*.

The plate depicts the constellations of Aquila, Antinous, Scutum Sobiesii, Taurus Poniatovii, Ophiuchus, and Serpens Ophiuchi.

The focus of the image, Ophiucus, is a large constellation straddling the celestial equator. Its name comes from the Greek Ὀφιοῦχος (*Ophioukhos*, "serpent-bearer"), and it is commonly represented, as here, grasping the constellation Serpens.

Barnard's Star, one of the stars nearest to our solar system, lies within the constellation Ophiuchus.
