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
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[First Appearance of Wyoming Territory] Map of Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado, Showing also the Southern portion of Dacotah

First Appearance of Wyoming Territory

Excellent early map of Rocky Mountains and Plains, from the 1868 edition of Mitchell's New General Atlas.

This is the first appearance of Wyoming Territory (created by the Wyoming Organic Act on July 25, 1868) on this series of Mitchell maps and one of the earliest appearances of Wyoming Territory on a printed map.

Kansas counties cover only the eastern third of the state. Nebraska counties cover less than half the state. Colorado has only approximately 15 counties. The gold regions near Denver are shown, as are a number of Indian Tribes, early towns, forts, etc. Dakota includes all of Wyoming.

The map shows early proposed railroads, forts, Indian tribes, rivers, mountains, etc. The plains region is still very much in transition, with the results of several major explorations commenced immediately after the civil war are not yet in evidence.

Also shows portions of New Mexico, Texas and Indian Territory.
