



## **Description:**

Nice example of the first state of Finley's map of Missouri, first published in 1824.

The map is hand colored by counties and shows towns, rivers, mountains and other geographical features.

One of the earliest obtainable maps of Missouri, with virtually none of the counties in its modern configuration. The majority of counties are contiguous to the Mississippi or Missouri Rivers, with massive Gasconade and Wayne Counties in the South, and Clay, Ray, Rallis and Chariton counties in the North.

Most of the information about towns and topography is also contiguous to these rivers.
