

Antique sea chart of bays on the coast of Baja California, published by the British Admiralty in the beginning of the 20th century, updating charts originally published in the middle of the 19th century.

The top map is of Playa Maria Bay, more commonly known today by the point at the top of the map called "Punta Maria". In the lower-left is a chart of "Port San Bartolome", now known as Bahia Tortuga. The bottom-right chart shows "Asuncion Bay" now called Bahia Asuncion.
