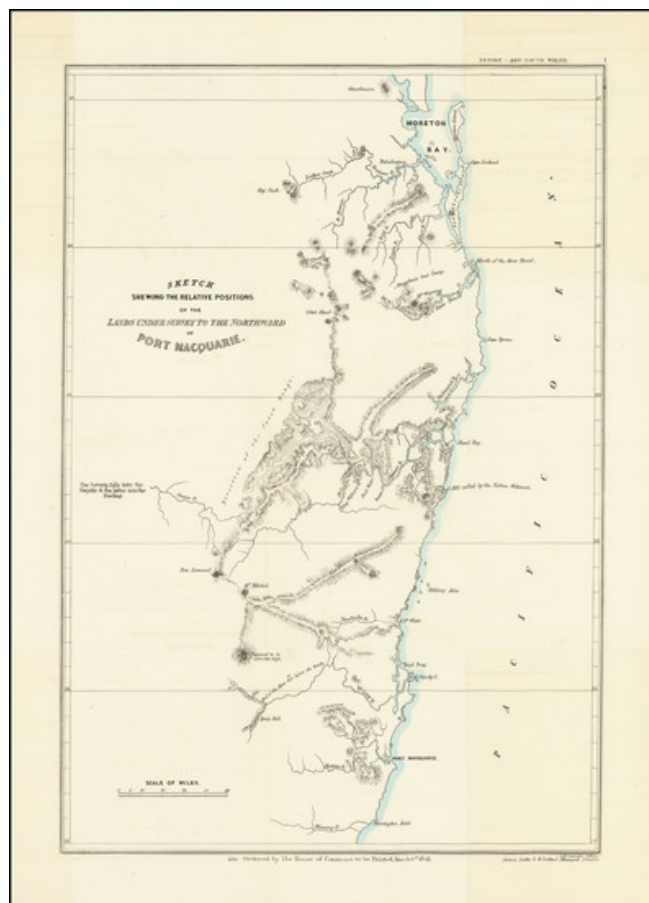

Description:

Rare John Arrowsmith Parliamentary Report map of the area from Port Macquarie to Brisbane and Gold Coast, printed in 1841.

The map shows the early surveys in the region and the nascent towns of Port Macquarie and Brisbane. Arrowsmith Parliamentary maps are far rarer than those that appeared in his atlases.

Interestingly, the Clarence River and Moreton Bay had only just been opened to settlers in 1838. Governor Gipps had ordered the area surveyed from July 1839, and the present map was in his report to Parliament on the problems faced by those trying to settle the area.
