Marvelous pictorial map of New Zealand, compiled and drawn by Alan Stuart Paterson, one of New Zealand's most prominent illustrators and cartoon artists of the 20th Century.

The map shows whimsical caricature figures re-enacting the major events from 1350 to 1860, with a key listing the events in the inset text box.



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The map was prepared for the New Zealand centenary in 1940, celebrating The Treaty of Waitangi between representatives of the United Kingdom and various Māori chiefs, bringing New Zealand into the British Empire and giving Māori the same rights as British subjects.

Alan Stuart Paterson (1902 - 1968) was a New Zealand cartoonist, illustrator, museum and art gallery curator.
