

Rare data visualization map focusing on real estate trends throughout American history, starting in the 1840s and going to the 1950s, published by Roy Wenzlick & Company.

The chart looks at different regional activities, different tax and monetary metrics, and business cycle correlations. There are graphs charting the cost of construction for numerous types of homes, inflation, etc.

Wenzlick rose to fame by predicting the boom in real estate values in the 1940s, the period covered by this graphic. Wenzlick was an avid antique map collector.
