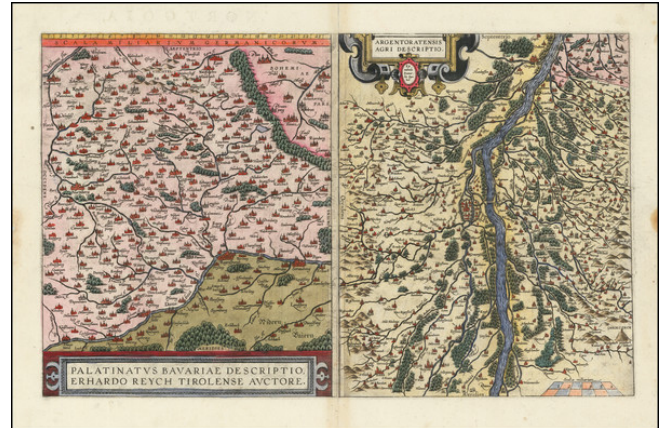

Description:

Interesting pair of early maps, published by Abraham Ortelius.

These two maps are attractively detailed, with cities, rivers, forests, and more all shown. The map of Bavaria shows the northern part of the province, focusing on the area around the Danube, namely Ingolstadt, Regensburg, and Straubing. This map was based on a 1540 map of the Bavarian Palatinate by Erhart Reich, published by Cristoph Zell in Nuremberg.

The map of the Rhine, both south and north of Strassbourg is based on Daniel Specklin's three-sheet map of the Elzas of 1576. The Bavaria map includes Regensberg, Nuremberg and Bamberg.

The map appeared in Ortelius' *Theatrum Orbis Terrarum*, the first modern atlas of the World.
