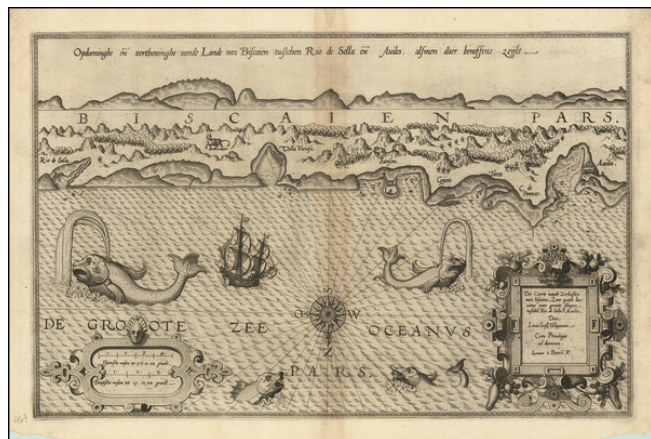

The map provides a highly detailed treatment of the Spanish Coastline, with profile views along the top. The cities of Villa Vicosa, Sanson, Gujon, Tores and C. de Pennas, also named.

The decorative embellishments includes a sailing ship, sea monsters, a large compass rose and other decorative features.

Waghenauer was a Dutch pilot who produced the first set of effective navigational charts, under the title Spiegel der Zeevaerdt. These gorgeous charts, engraved by Baptist and Jan van Doetecum, embody the latest contemporary knowledge of navigation and position finding and set the standard which was followed for more than a century. Waghenauer's charts are magnificent works of art, which are highly sought after by collectors.
