Fine old color example of the Blaeu's map of the Siege of Grave in 1602.

The siege of Grave (July 18 to September 20, 1602) was part of the Eighty Years' War and the Anglo-Spanish War. The Spanish-held city of Grave was besieged by a Dutch and English army led by Maurice of Orange and Francis Vere respectively.

After a siege of nearly two months the city surrendered when a Spanish relief army under Francisco de Mendoza was defeated just outside the city by the besiegers. The defeat was severe enough to cause a major mutiny in the Spanish army.
