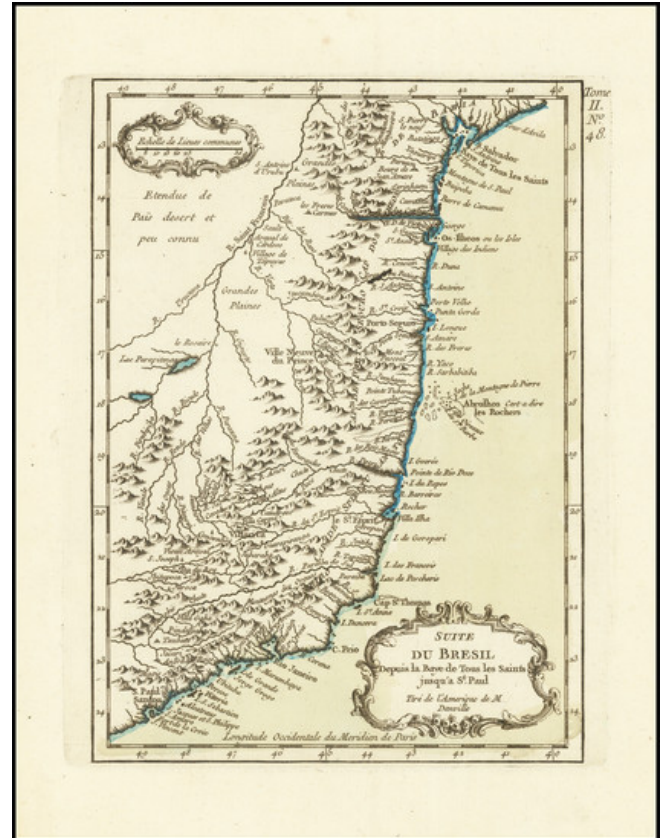

Description:

Detailed map of a part of Brazil, extending from the mouth of the Rio de la Plata in the south to Cativa and Barre d' Iguape in the north. In the south of the map, Rio de Janeiro can be identified as a large bay on the coast, with Sao Paulo nearby. Many rivers, ports, towns, islands, and mountains are shown and denominated. In the northwest of the map is described a "stretch of the country deserted and little known." The map is attractively presented and delicately colored.

The map appeared in Jacques Nicolas Bellin's *Le Petit Atlas Maritime Recueti de Cartes et Plans des Quatre Parlies du Monde en Cinq Volumes*, first published in Paris in 1764. The *Atlas* was a delightful small-sized pilot, showing many places of interest around the world.
