Description:

First state of the Johnson map of the region, showing Nebraska extending to the Rocky Mountains and Canada and Kansas extending into Colorado. Marvelous early territorial depiction, prior to the creation of Colorado, Wyoming, Idaho and Montana. Includes early forts, Indian Tribes, early routes of exploration, etc. A number of Indian Reservations are shown in eastern Kansas. The Southern Route for the Railroad Route to the Pacific explored by Capt. Gunnison is shown, as is the Smith & Stevens Routes. Several Railroads extend into Kansas. A few early Post Offices are also shown. Denver, Aurora and St. Vrain's Fort appear in Colorado. Nebraska Territory is still largely unexplored, with significant geographical gaps in the basic knowledge of the region. An essential map for regional collectors.
