Nice example of the 1839 edition of Samuel Augustus Mitchell's pocket map of Indiana.

The map is hand-colored by counties and shows roads, railroads, towns, and distances. Two tables include the population of Indiana's counties in 1830 and the steamboat routes to Louisville, New Orleans, etc., interesting historical details, including the Harris Line surveyed in 1817 and Fulton's Line surveyed in Pittsburg, Lafayette, and Indianapolis.

A Miami Indian Reservation is shown in the northern center of the state. "Country Ceded by the Pottawatomies" has been overtaken by county divisions in the northwest.
