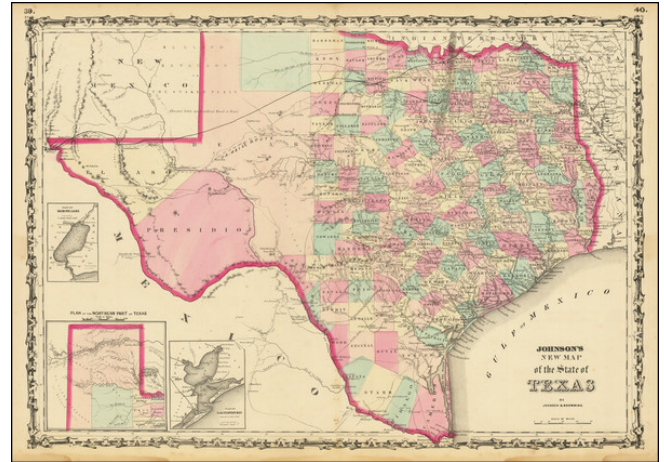
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Johnson's New Map of the State of Texas

Description:

A striking large format map of Texas, published by Johnson & Browning in New York and Richmond, Virginia.

The map is hand colored by counties, with large insets of the northern panhandle, Galveston and Sabine Lake. The map reflects the relative expansion of the Counties of Texas, with more or less the current configurations in the east but overall very few in the west. The map shows towns, railroads (actual and proposed), stations, lakes, rivers, and important early roads and explorers routes. Some of the Military Outposts and Indian information is also shown.

Early states of the Johnson map of Texas are now increasingly difficult to obtain, especially the pre-Civil War editions.

Detailed Condition:
