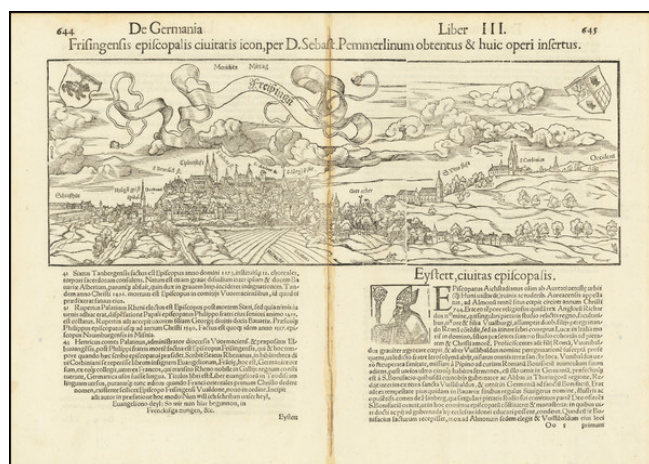

Original antique woodblock showing the city of Freising in southern Germany. The map names many places in the city, and shows two coats of arms floating above.

Freising is notable for being the site of the first recorded European tornado, from 788. Shortly after the publication of this map, the city would go into decline following the Thirty Years' War, particularly when Gustavus Adolphus ransomed then sacked the city.

This map was published by Gerard Mercator, one of the earliest publishers of city views in Europe.
