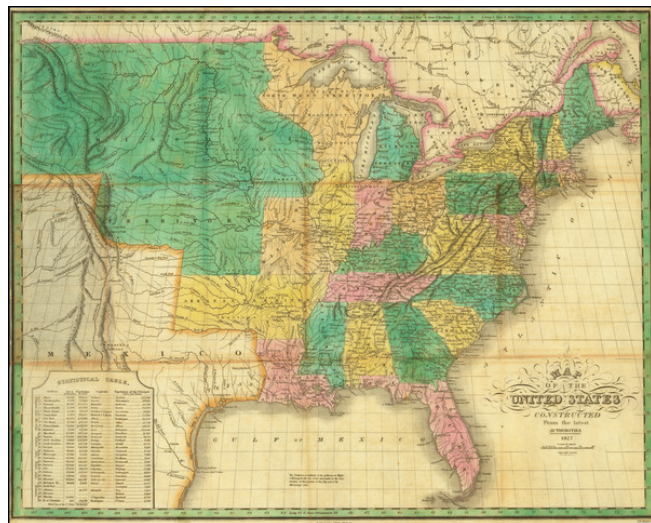

Description:

Massive Missouri Territory and Old Northwest Territory Shown

Rare separately published 1827 edition of Anthony Finley's early map of the United States, first published in Philadelphia in 1825.

Finley's map provides a good look at the United States following the Adams-Onís Treaty in 1819 and shortly after Mexican independence in 1821. The map extends westward to depict the northwest, Missouri and "Arkansa" territories, and the province of Mexico, including Texas. A very large Northwest Territory is also shown.

The map draws extensively from Lewis & Clark, Pike, Humboldt, and others.

Includes a large statistical table with information on the various states and cities, including the population of New York City at 123,706.

Rarity

The 1827 edition of Finley's pocket map is rare on the market. No examples are shown in AMPR.
