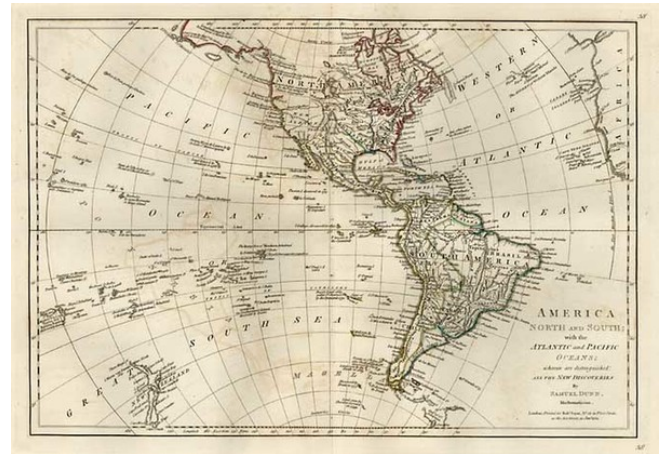

Interesting map of America and the Pacific, extending to New Zealand and the South Pacific. The map is a fascinating look at the region on the showing first incorporation of the discoveries of Capt. James Cook on the maps of the period. Cook's Strait appears in New Zealand. The NW Coast of America is based largely on the earlier cartography. The Sea of the West is not shown, but the River of the West extends from Aguilar's entrance to the river system SW of Winnipeg Lake. There is tremendous detail showing the Russian discoveries along the NW Coast and a fascinating reference to the discoveries of the Chinese (Fousang) in North America. Many of the islands in the Pacific includes notes and discovery dates. From Dunn's New Atlas or Mundane System of Geography, printed for Robert Sayer at 53 Fleet Street, London.
