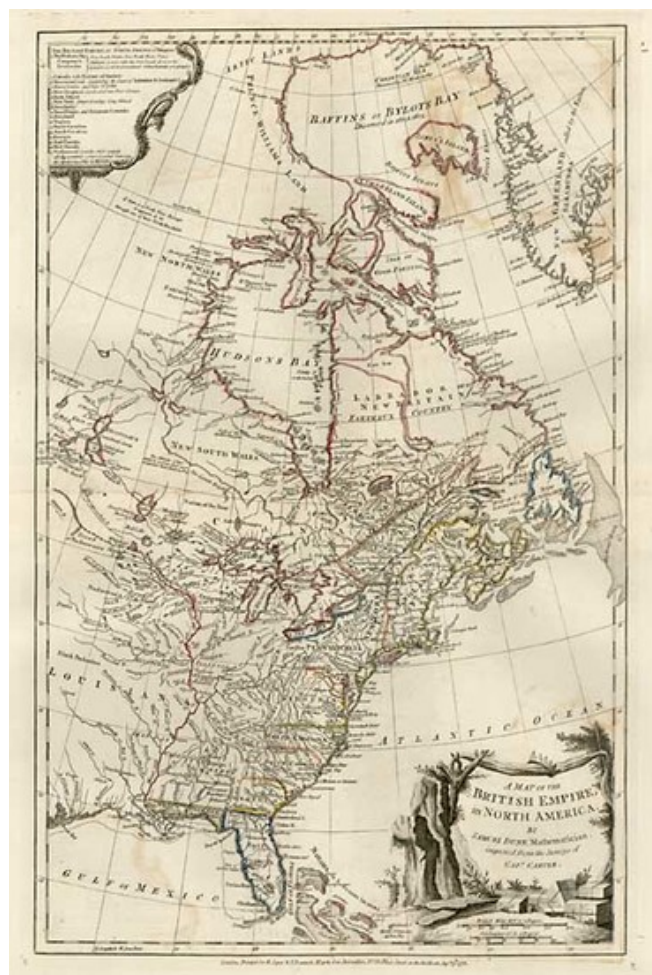

Scarce map of the The American Colonies at the outset of the American Revolution. The 13 British Colonies are named, along with East and West Florida, Louisiana, and excellent detail in Canada. The map shows remarkable detail between the Appalachians, Alleghanyys and the Mississippi River, including forts, Indian Tribes and a host of explanatory note. The conjectural treatment of the Rivers and Mountains west of the Mississippi River in the Upper Plains and in the Great Lakes region is also noteworthy. A bit of offsetting in the upper right corner, else a near fine example with wide margins. From Dunn's New Atlas or Mundane System of Geography, printed for Sayer & Bennett at 53 Fleet Street, London. The true first state of the map. Wide clean margins and strong thick paper.
