

Detailed map of America, published by Guillaume De L'Isle in 1722 and updated by Philippe Buache in 1745.

The map shows a blank coastline above Cap Blanc and the mythical entry of D'Aguilar.

The map shows tremendous detail throughout. Nice detail in California and the Southwest. The course of the Mississippi si pushed considerably west of its true location, but the Missouri River is shown in a remarkably accurate fashion, with headwaters in the Northern Rocky Mountains. The map is rich with Indian and other early American details.

Decorative cartouche, compass rose and extensive notes throughout the map.
