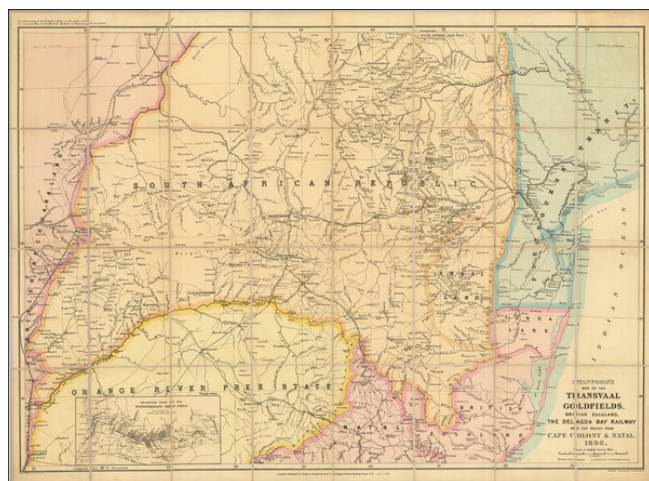

Description:

Scarce and interesting Witwatersrand Gold Rush map centered around Pretoria, showing many ephemeral details of political geography, transportation, mining, etc.

The map was published on January 1, 1896, in London by Stanford's Geographical Establishment. A series of notes below the neatline in the lower-left corner indicates that the map was published in 1889, '90, '93, '95, and '96.

The map covers some or all of Orange River Free State, Natal, South African Republic, Swaziland, British Bechuanaland, British Zululand, Tongaland, and Portuguese Territory.

In the lower-left corner is an inset map "Enlarged Map of the Witwatersrand Gold Field"
