

Scarce antique Rand McNally map of the world from the end of the 19th century.

Many former capitals and former capital names appear on this map: Christiania (Oslo), St. Petersburg, Constantinople (Istanbul), Bukhara in Turkestan (modern-day Uzbekistan), Abomey in the Kingdom of Dahomey (modern-day Benin), Gondar in Ethiopia, New Dongola in Nubia (Northern Sudan), and Murzuk as the capital of Ottoman Fezzan. The Orange Free State, Transvaal Republic, Cape Colony, and Colony of Natal are delineated in southern Africa. Greenland is divided into North Greenland, South Greenland, East Greenland, and Scoresby's Land. In the Pacific, the Anson Archipelago is mapped, including the phantom islands of Rica de Plata and Rica de Oro.

Central America, at the time a British Crown Colony, is not particularly detailed.
