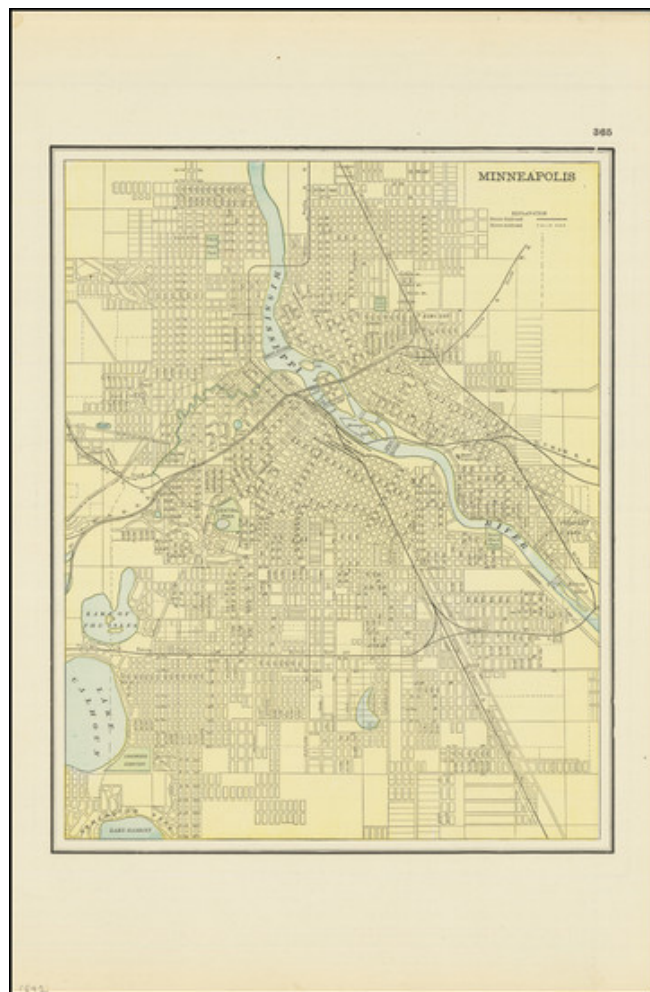

Description:

Detailed antique city plan of Minneapolis, showing streets, buildings, steam and horse rail lines, public places, rivers, etc.

The map shows Lake of the Isles, Lake Calhoun (Bde Maka Ska), Lake Harriet, and Powderhorn Lake (the latter is shown in such a way that suggests a plan to fill it in).

There is sporadic development below 34th Street and elsewhere.

Cram was one of the pre-eminent American Mapmakers of the late 19th Century, relying upon a



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cerographic printing process first applied to maps by the Morse family in the late 1830s, ultimately leading to the demise of the hand-colored map.
