

Description:

Highly detailed separately-issued Rand McNally pocket map of California, with insets of coastal Southern California (including Los Angeles, Orange County, and San Diego) and the Bay Area.

As with many of these early California maps, there are plenty of toponyms that have subsequently been subsumed by larger metropolitan areas. Ladrillo, north of Pacific Beach, likely refers to Ladrillo Station, after the Spanish word for "brick," in Rose Canyon, and where the Rose Canyon Brick Company operated. The rail station at "Tia Juana," in the present-day location of San Ysidro, California, was a subdivision called "Tia Juana City," developed in 1887 by the real estate firm Hart and Stern, around the same that Tijuana was being developed across the border in Mexico.

The map includes a list of twenty-eight railroads operating in California. Populations of major California cities are also listed.
