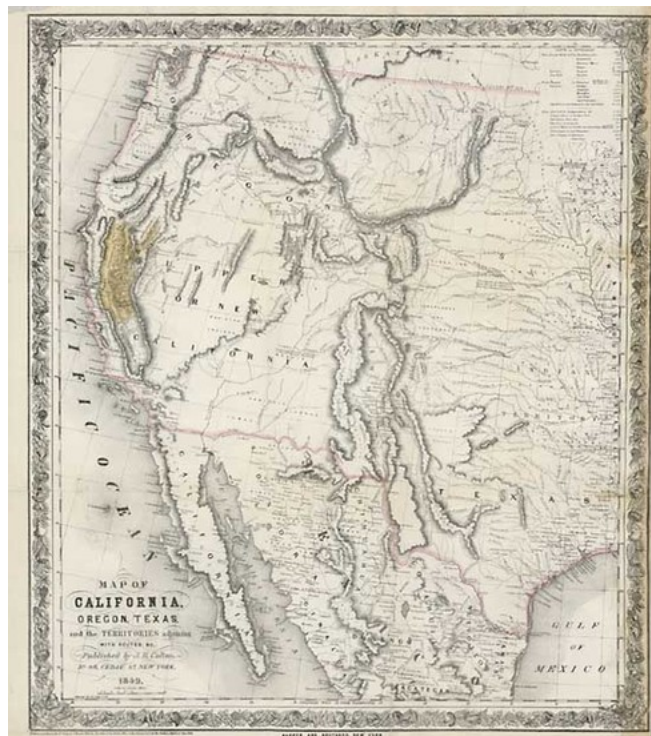
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Map of California, Oregon, Texas, and the Territories adjoining with Routes &c. 1849

Description:

An detailed map of the west, which Whesat described as a combination of the 1848 Fremont and the 1849 Tanner, with a big splotch of yellow representing El Dorado or the Gold Region. The map appeared in Oregon and California in 1848 by J. Quinn Thornton. There is also evidence that it was issued separately. Wheast 593. The map is curiously similar to the map which accompanied the Hosea Horne Overland Guide, suggesting that the map was drawn from a larger plate. Excellent detail of the supposed rivers and mountains. Includes numerous exploration routes and early Indian details. A table in the upper right gives distances to the mining regions. Via several routes. The right side has been supported with some discloration, but is still a very presentable example.
