### Description:

Rand McNally map of Georgia, showing many physical and political details, as well as railroads. Already, Georgia has more than 100 counties. Possibly planned so residents could make a roundtrip visit to their county seat via wagon in one day (though this story may be apocryphal), with advancements in travel, counties continued to proliferate during the county unit voting system. In 1945, the state constitution capped the number of counties at 159.

The now-defunct counties of Campbell (I4-5) and Milton (G5-6) are present before each was merged with neighboring counties during the Great Depression. North of Atlanta, Sandy Springs is labeled "Hammond", at the time a rural community.
