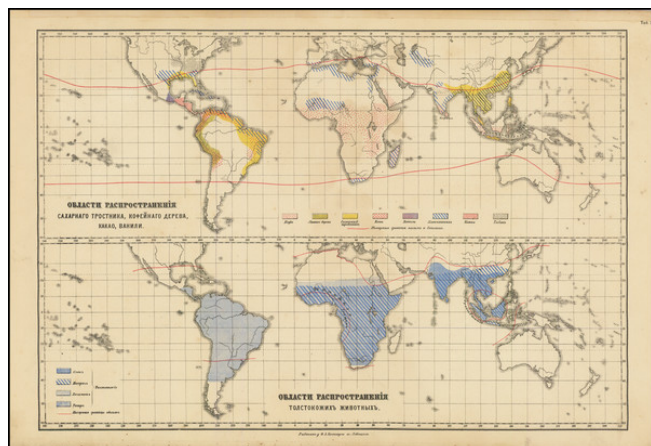

Created by Friedrich Arnold Brockhaus and published in Leipzig around 1890, the maps are written in Russian, which is unusual for maps of these subjects and time periods.
