The 1936 Summer Olympics, officially known as the Games of the XI Olympiad, was an international multisport event held in 1936 in Berlin, Nazi Germany. These games are notable for Adolf Hitler's use of them to showcase his ideas of Aryan supremacy and for the controversial decision of many countries to participate despite the host country's aggressive policies. The games were also notable for Jesse Owens' four gold medals in track and field, which challenged Hitler's notions of Aryan supremacy.
