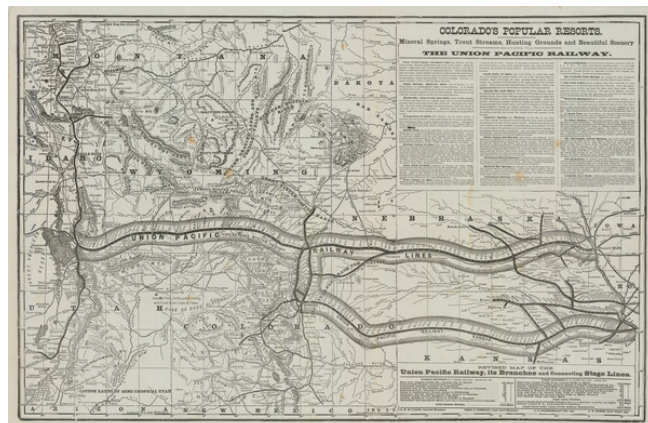

Rare promotional railroad map of the mid-continent, extending from Omaha and Kansas City in the East to Helena, Butte, Lovells, Bonanza City, Blackfoot, Ogden, St. George and the mining districts of Southwestern Colorado, centered on Colorado, Wyoming and Montana.

A rare and highly detailed map, which shows extraordinary detail, with railroads, stations, towns, mines and mining districts, cattle grazing, timber, wild game and other information throughout the map.

This is one of at least two states of the map (this would appear to be the earlier of the two states, without railroad tracks on the Denver & Rio Grande line to Animas Springs).
