## **Description:**

Rare Italian map of the city of Kamianets-Podilskyi in western Ukraine, produced in July of 1684 and showing the town in fine detail.

The map shows the town from the southwest, prominently featuring the deep u-bend in the Smotrych River that has almost turned into an Oxbow Lake. The city's castle, high above the city, is seen at the base of the map. The map includes two lengthy keys to the left and to the right of the map, which name places throughout the castle and town.

The town was at the end of many years of Polish rule when this map was made and had just passed into
