

Description:

One of the earliest appearances of Wyoming on a map--so early, it has not yet been added to the map title. Pre-dates Yellowstone. Yellowstone Lake is also called Subletts Lake and is pushed far to the west of its actual location. The region between the Yellowstone River and the North Platte is largely unknown. Dakota & Wyoming have no counties. Idaho has only 5 counties. Montana has 9 counties. Shows early explorers routes, forts, roads, towns, villages, Indians etc. Gold Mines in Western Montana. also shows a number of proposed railroad routes, trading posts etc. Several other Gold regions, including one in Idaho. This is the very unusual early edition of the map, showing Wyoming extending over to Red Butte, some 100 miles west of its true border. A rare configuration. An unusually nice example, with only a tiny bit of foxing at the lower margin.
