



Description:

Striking map of the state from Finley's atlas, colored by counties and showing towns, roads, rivers, mountains and other geographical features. Excellent Indian detail in the Northern two-thirds of the state, which lacks a number of Northern Counties. This map is distinguishable from later editions, as it still shows the original massive Hindes Parish below the Choctaw Indian lands prior to its division into Washington, Yazoo, Madison, Copia and Simpson Parishes, with Washington being the last to appear for the first time in 1828 and therefore not appearing on this edition of the map. The later editions also show several Missionary Stations in the Indian Lands which are not present in the early states of the map , while the early Indian Agencies begin to disappear.
