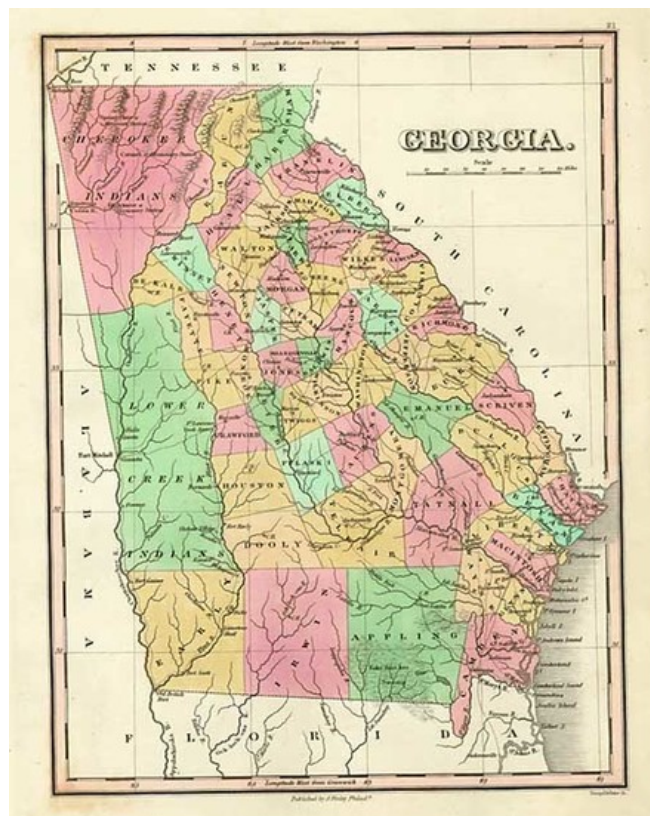

Description:

Striking map of the state from Finley's atlas, colored by counties and showing towns, roads, rivers, mountains and other geographical features. Excellent Indian detail in the Northern two-thirds of the state, which includes Cherokee Indian and Lower Creek Indian Lands. Several Missionary Stations and a Moravian Station are shown, along with the Creek Agency and a number of early forts. Finley's maps are one of only two obtainable from American Atlases published in the 1820s, with Finley's General Atlas being the biggest commercial success of the era. Others include Carey & Lea, and the now virtually unobtainable maps from Fielding Lucas, and larger format maps from H.S. Tanner's New American Atlas and Finley's New American Atlas.
