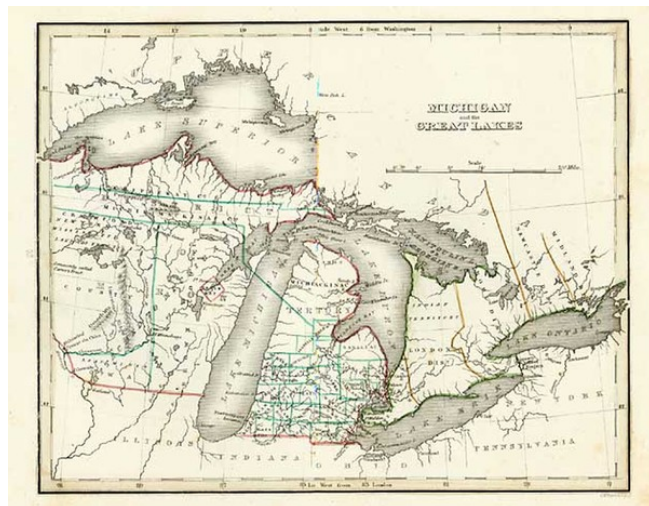

Description:

One of the most interesting of all of the Bradford maps is this map of Michigan Territory and adjoining regions. Michigan proper is shown with counties in the southern half, the north being Ottawa and Michilmackinack lands. To the west of Lake Michigan is a region oddly subdivided and called Distric of Huron and Attached to Michigan, which extends to the Mississippi. It notes the Crawford County (comprising most of Minnesota), Mississippi and New York Land Co. Tracts, Carver's Tracts, Chippeway County, Michilimackinac County (both reaching to the Mississippi River) Brown County (comprising most of Wisconsin) and a square identified as Green Bay. East of Lake Huron, the London District, Home District, New Castle District and Midland District are shown. Locates forts, towns, lakes, mountains, rivers, and names early counties. A marvelous transitional map.
