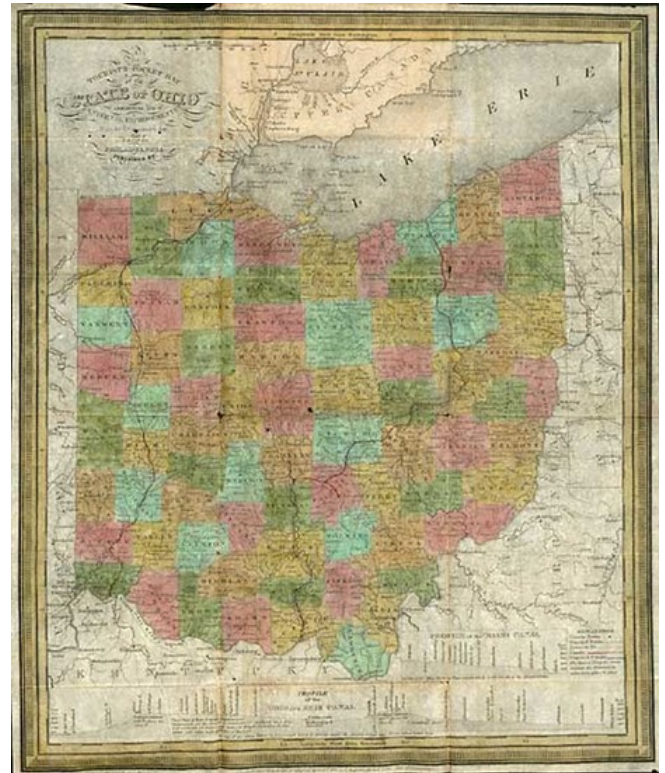

Nice example of Mitchell's first pocket map of Ohio, which was first issued in 1831. The map is colored by counties and shows, roads, railroads, towns, distances and a profile of the Erie Canal, several other proposed railroads and canals, and some interesting historical details, including the Harris Line surveyed in 1817, and Fulton's Line surveyed in 1814. Small profile of the Miami Canal. A good example, with a few short fold splits, none more than an inch or so, and minor toning. Folding into brown 16mo cloth covers, with gilt title. Covers a bit scuffed and cracked at spine. Still a good example.
