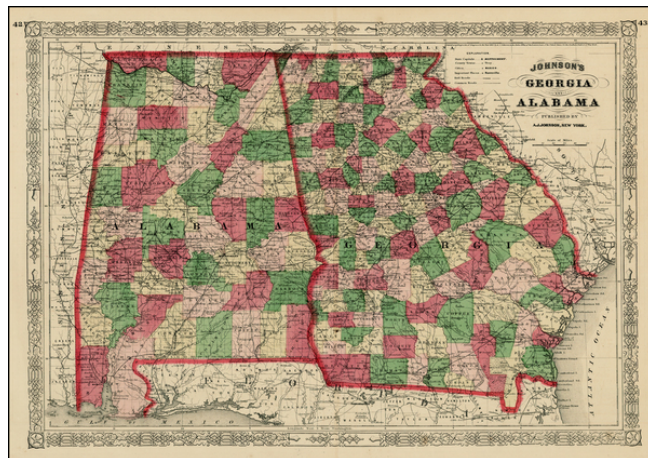

Highly detailed Civil War era map of Georgia and Alabama, vividly hand colored by counties and listing towns, railroads, common roads, rivers, swamps and important places. Alvin Johnson was one of the most significant atlas publishers of the second half of the 19th Century. First with partners Browning and later Ward, and then on his own, he issued his Illustrated Family Atlas from 1860 to the 1880s, following a brief collaborations with Colton in the late 1850s. Johnson's atlas was the largest of the popular American Atlases and provided wonderful transitional details of the geography, geopolitics and general growth of the US and its territories.
