### Description:

The scarce 1821 state of John Cary's map of the Old Northwest and Great Lakes regions, from his New Universal Atlas. While the map includes excellent detail from Virginia and the Chesapeake to Lake Erie, Lake Ontario and Upper Canada, its most remarkable features are in the Great Lakes and Midwest Regions, where Illinois Territory, Indiana Territory, Michigan Territory and Northwest Territory and Ohio are shown in marvelous detail, extending West to the Mississippi River. This edition of the map has been substantially revised, to include the roads, settlements and Indian Villages which are appearing in the New Territories. The 1793 Boundary Line of the Indian Treaty under Gen. Wayne Still appears, as do a number of early Forts in Indiana and the site of Gen. Sinclair's defeat in 1791. Along the Wabash, there is a note regarding its navigability. Several important portages are noted between the rivers which link Lake Michigan and Lake Erie with the Mississippi. An note in Kentucky observes its discovery by Js. Machbride in 1754 and exploration by Col. D. Boon in 1769, leading to the first settlement in 1773. A note on the length of the Ohio makes reference to the work of Thomas Hutchins. Chicago is not shown, but Ft. Dearborn appears. The Moravian Settlement between Lake Huron and St. Clair appears. Many early notes throughout the Midwest and new Northwest Territory. A fine copy in full wash color with wide margins.
